



## Your doctor has ordered the following medicine:

## Supplies need for your infusion:

- Freedom 60 Pump
- Freedom 60 Tubing (60 ml/hr or 120 ml/hr)
- Filter
- Alcohol Pads
- Medicine
- Pre-filled Normal Saline Syringe
- Pre-filled Heparin Syringe

## Getting Started:

1. Clean and set up work area.
2. Wash your hands
3. Put together the medicine syringe and the tubing and filter.
4. Make sure the pump is "OFF".
5. Turn the large knob clockwise until the black tab is at the end of the clear tube of the pump.
6. Put the medicine syringe into the clear tube of the pump.

7. Turn pump "ON" and prime air from the tubing, then clamp tubing.
8. Clean the needleless cap with alcohol pad for 15 seconds then connect it to your child's IV tubing.
9. Make sure pump is "ON" and unclamp tubing.

**IMPORTANT:** The Freedom 60 pump does not have an alarm. Make sure to set an alarm to alert you when the medicine is complete.

## When Infusion is Completed:

1. Turn switch to "OFF".
2. Turn the large knob clockwise until black tab is at end of the clear tube of pump.
3. Remove the syringe from the pump.
4. Place a cap on the filter side of the tubing or loop tubing together and store tubing for next dose of medicine.
5. Attach prefilled syringe of Normal Saline to the needleless cap and flush the line. Throw away empty syringe.
6. Attached prefilled syringe of Heparin to the needleless cap and flush the line. Throw empty syringe away.

**REMEMBER:** IV tubing and filter can be used for 24 hours then thrown away.
