

HOME SAFETY PLAN

Walk through your home with this checklist. Make sure all poisons are either stored in a locked cabinet or out of children's sight and reach.

GARAGE

Keep potentially poisonous products, like bug spray and car cleaners in their original containers so they can't be mistaken for something else.

KITCHEN

Cleaning products and medication can look like juice and candy to a child who can't read the labels.

BATHROOM

Items like makeup, perfume and eye drops are all poisonous and need to be stored safely.

LAUNDRY ROOM

Keep liquid laundry packets in their original container, closed and out of a child's reach.

BEDROOM

DON'T keep medications in your nightstand, dresser or other places that your child can reach.

PURSE

Make sure purses that could contain poisonous items like medications, hand sanitizer or e-cigarettes are kept out of the reach of kids at all times.
